Dedication

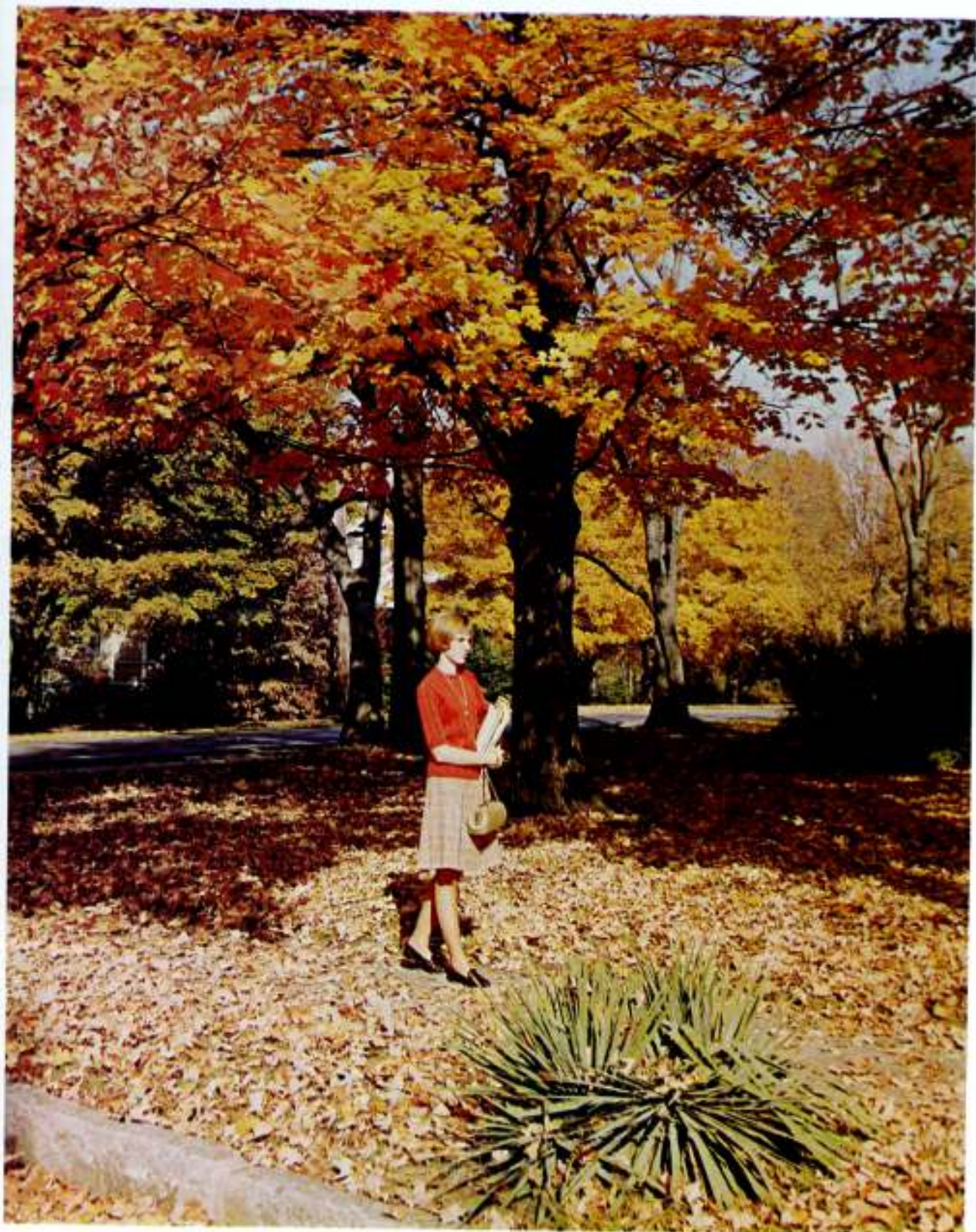

A DAY BEGINS . . .

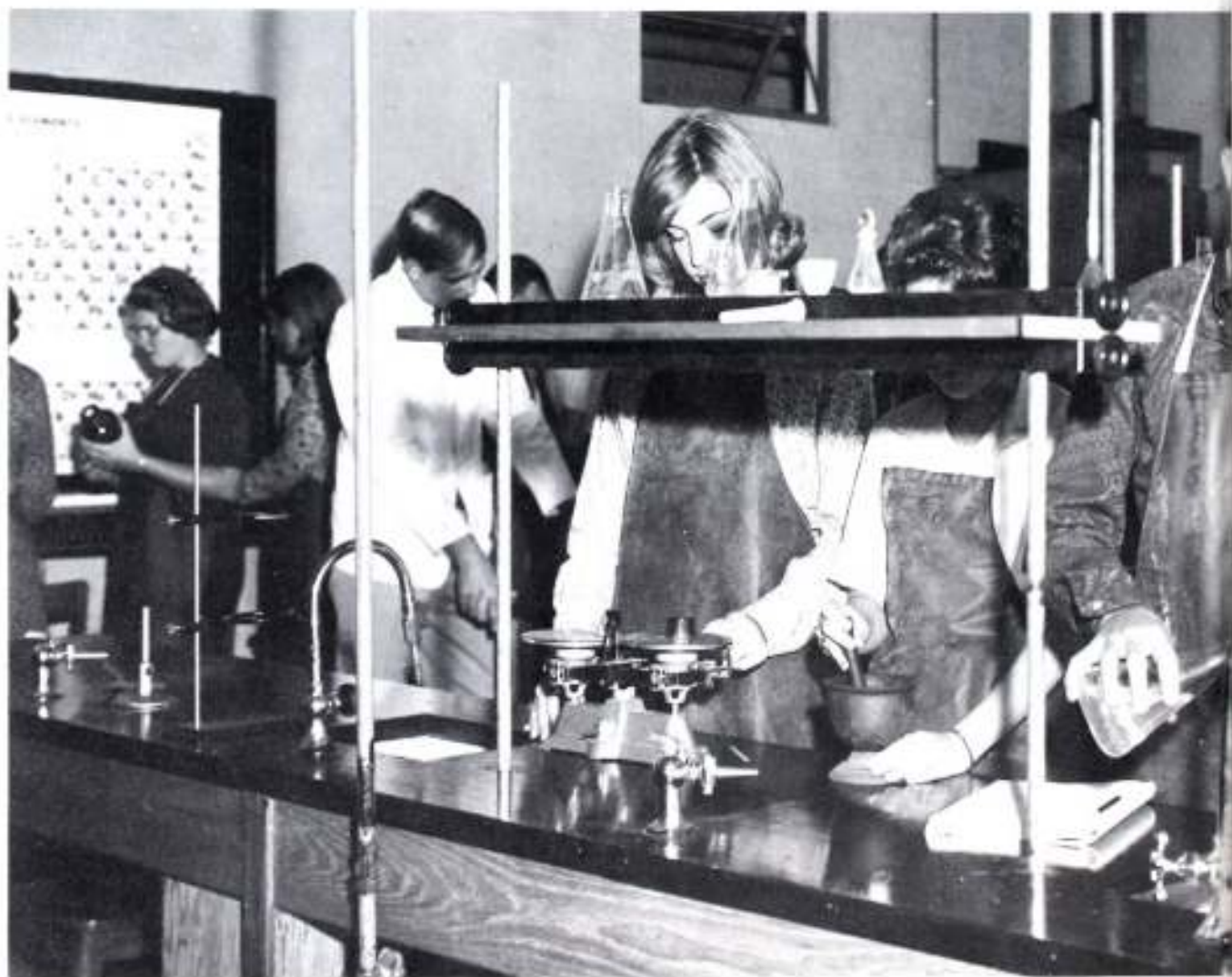

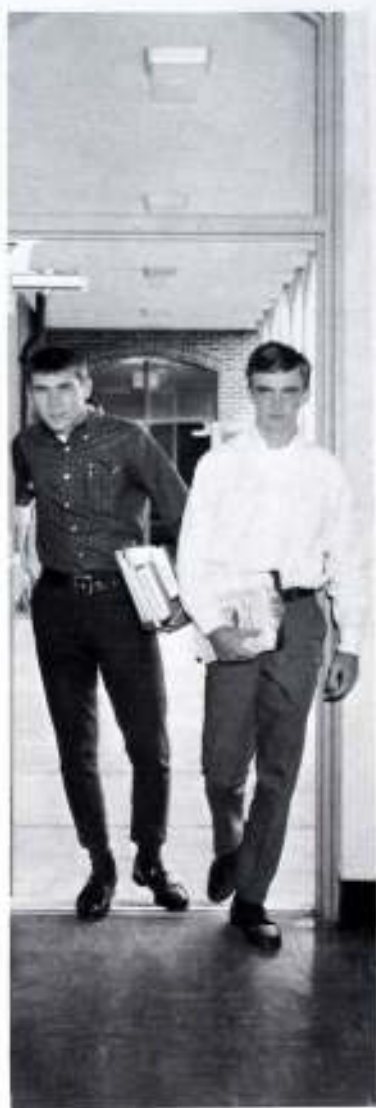

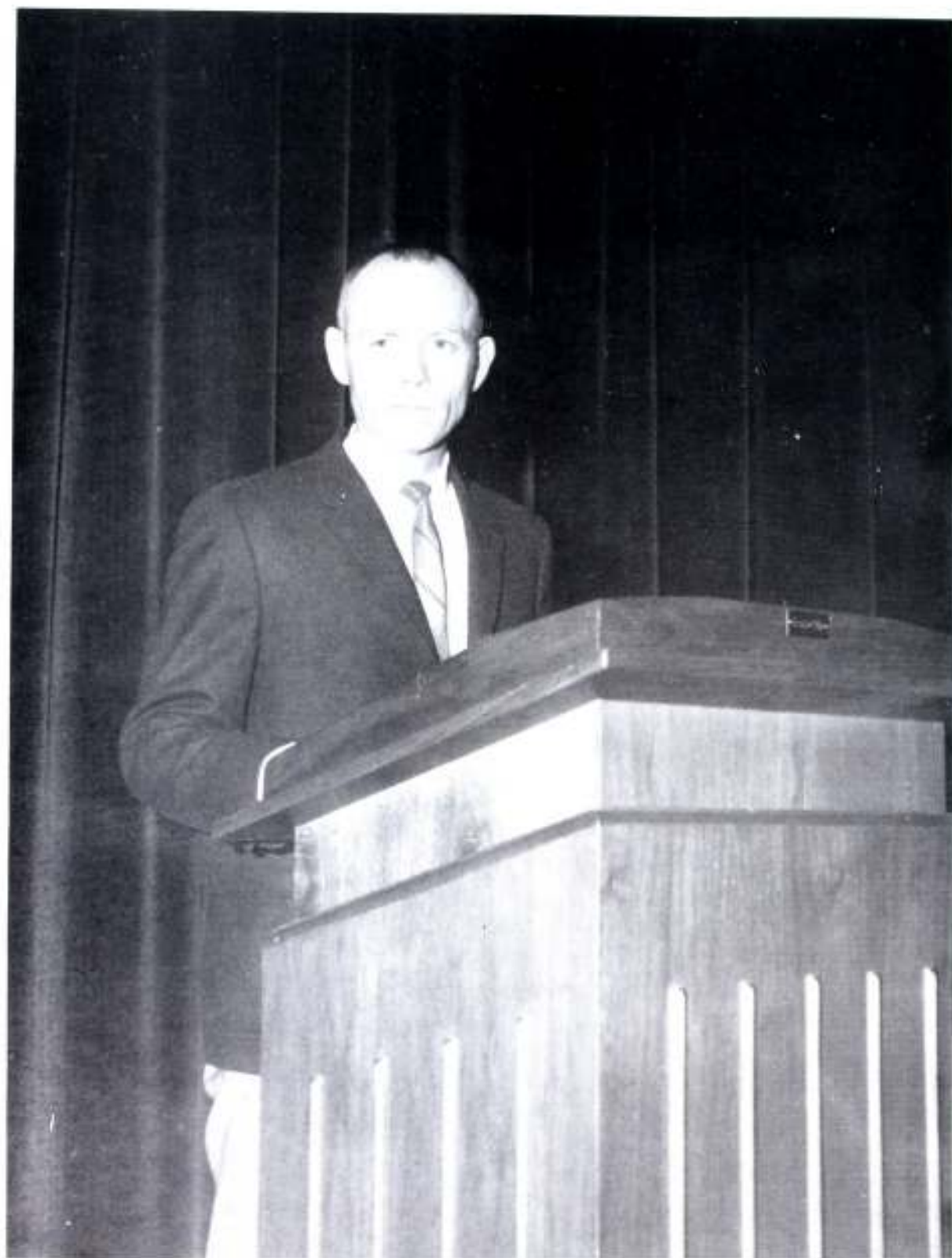




ACADEMICS

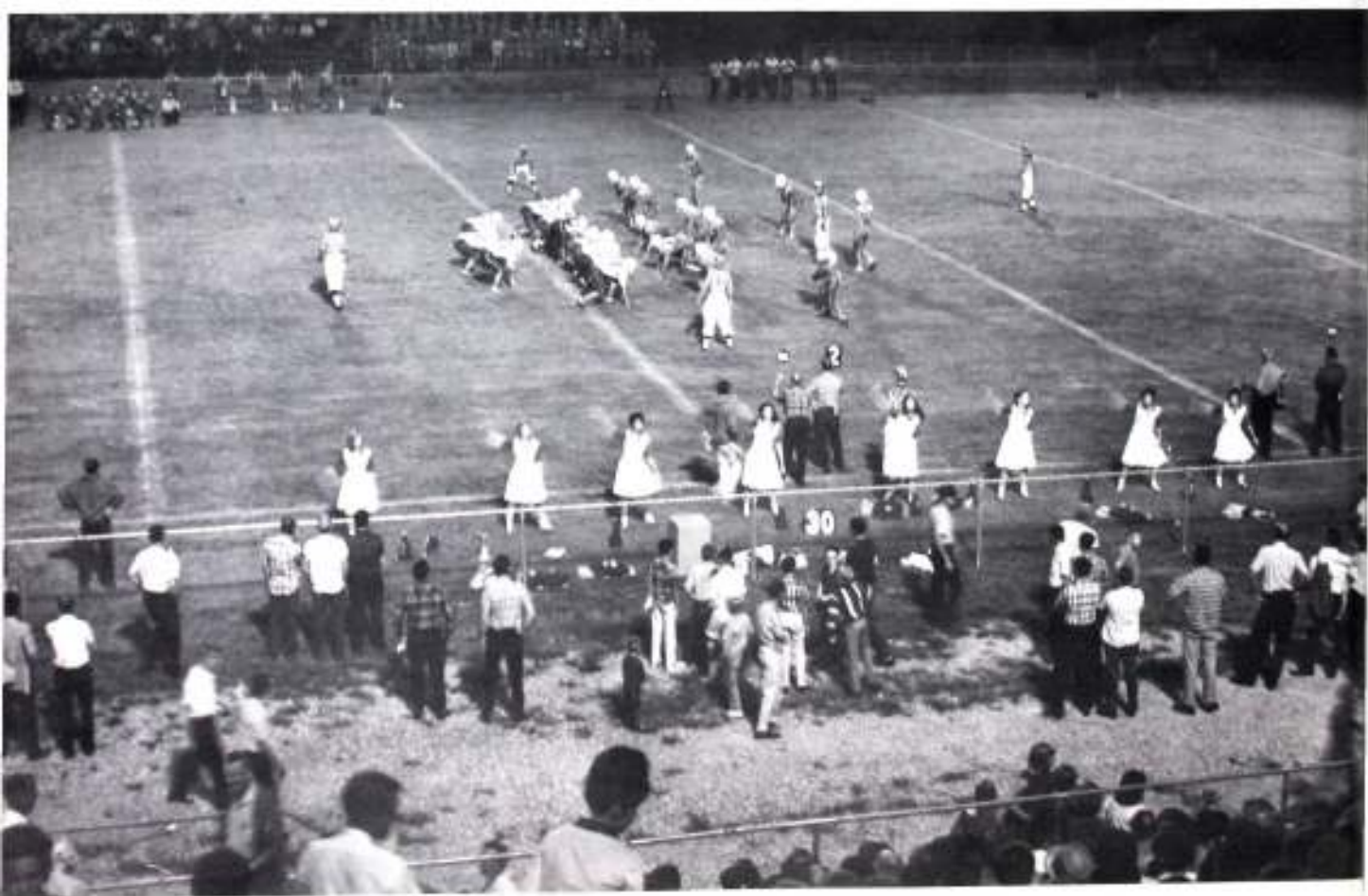
Football 1966

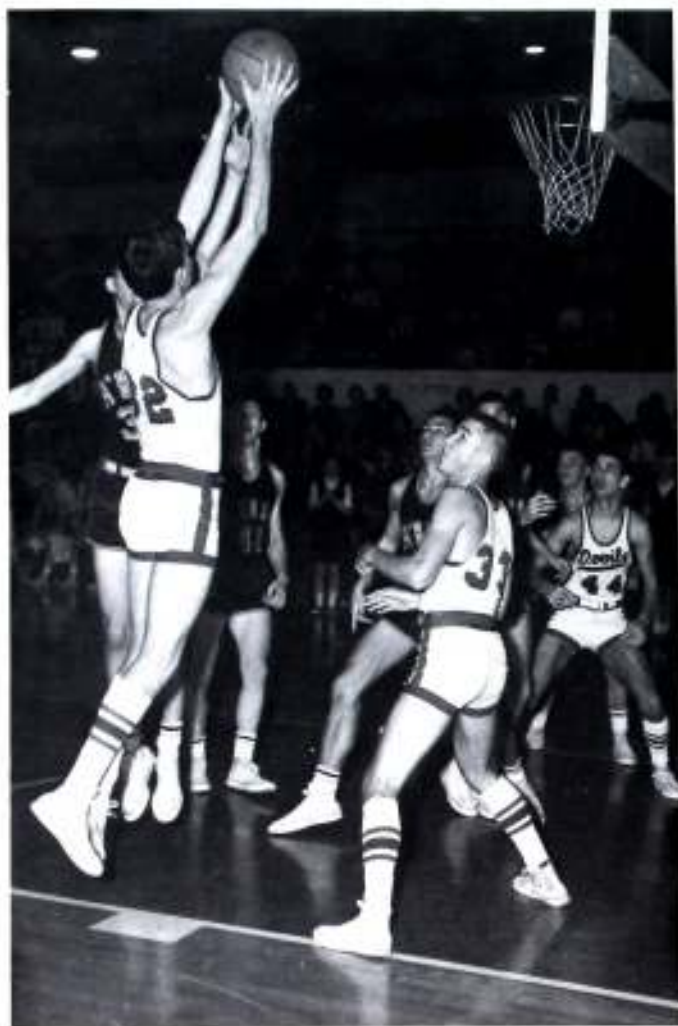

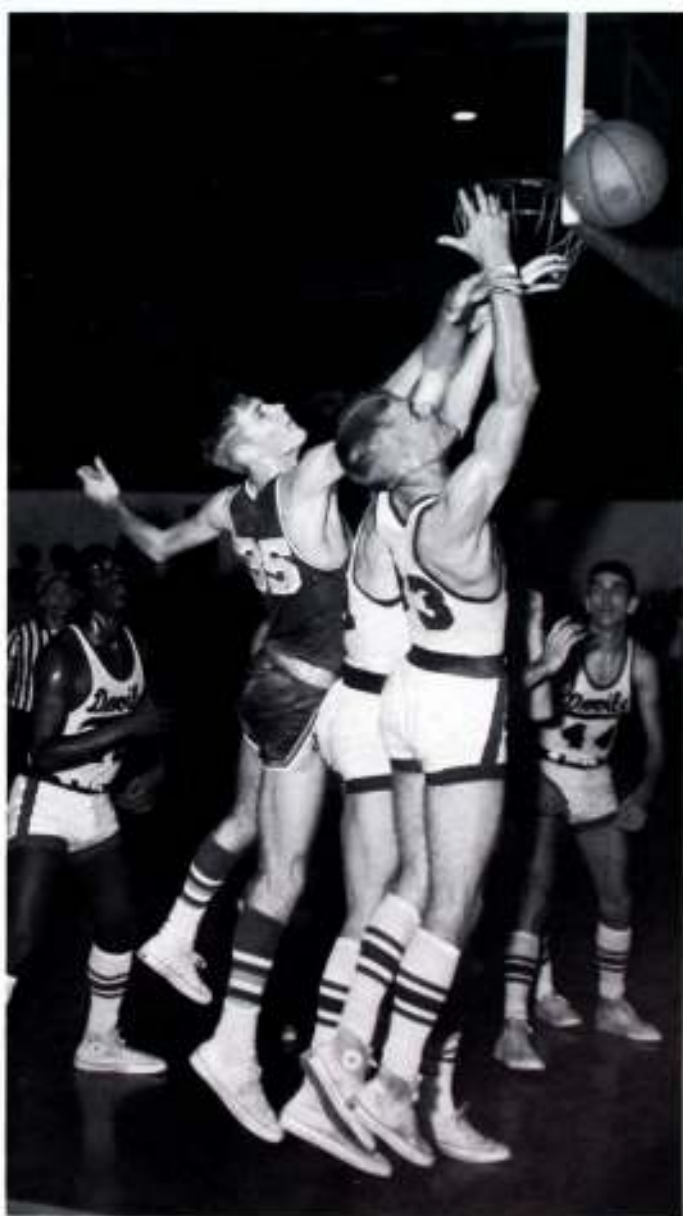

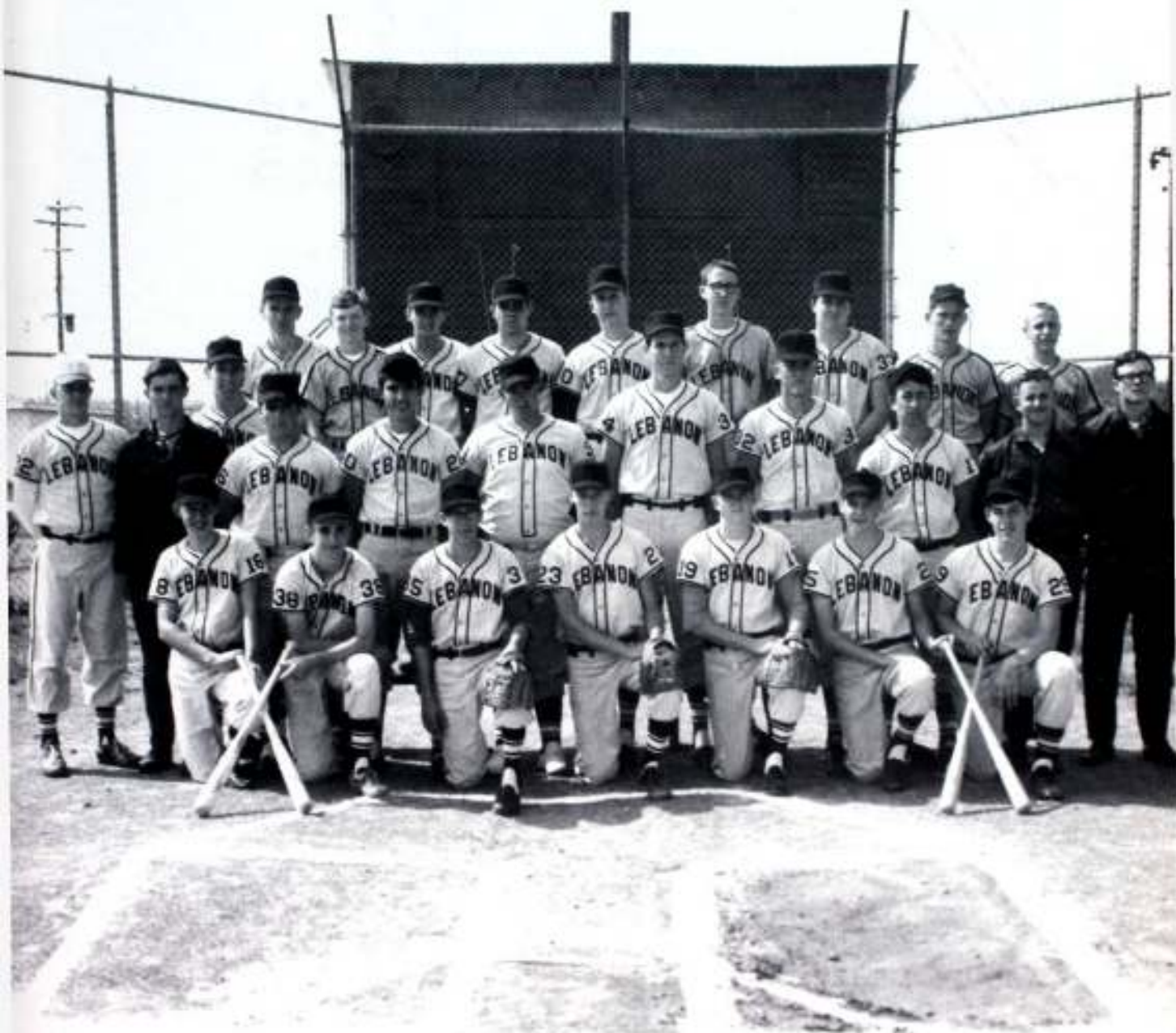
